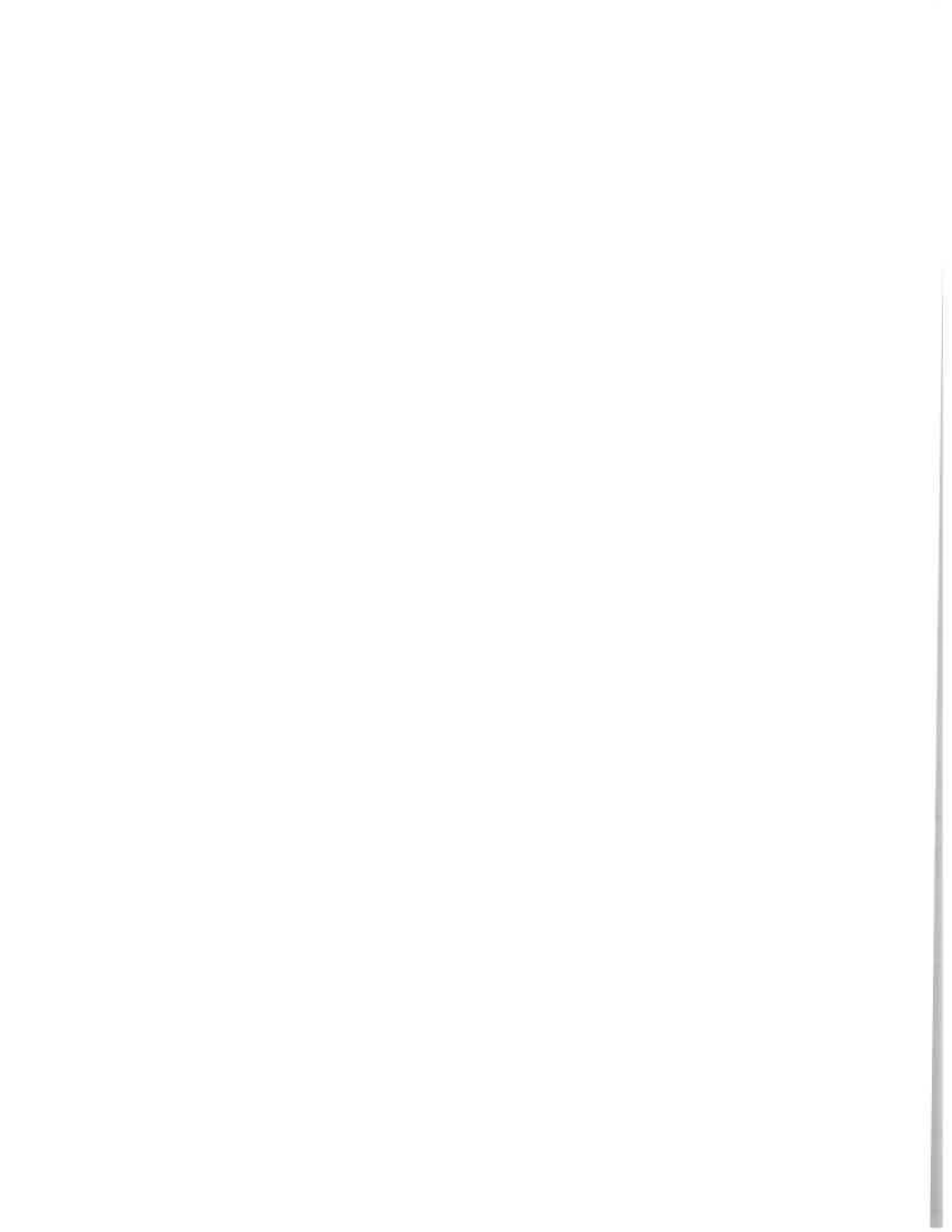

## **Rams Football 2018**

If someone would have told me I was going to be the Head Football coach during the spring and early summer of 2018, I would of laughed, but as the season grew closer without a lack of direction and leadership, that seemed like a possibility. This season for us as a staff and a program was tough, because we had no time to prepare these players for a tougher schedule compared to the 2017 season. Unfortunately, we had to focus on schemes and not individual development in August. Me and my staff did not become officially approved until the September school board meeting. Besides all the set backs and delays, I am glad to be here!

This season started off strong for us, with a 52-6 road win against Montrose who is a quad A program. From that point on, it was a roller coaster type of season. We lost 3 games, by a combined total of 5 points in 2018. Next year, those loses are wins. We had a 16-0 halftime lead against Athens, but lost 18-16. We had a 8-7 4th quarter lead vs. Troy, but lost by a field goal with 14 seconds remaining in the game. From a defensive standpoint, they played well all year long. Our defense was our most constant aspect of our game all year. Also, I appreciate the attitude and no nonsense approach that our players had. It was tough on the seniors, having a staff named in August, but every senior was extremely supportive of myself and the staff. I just wish I had more time with them.

Going forward, next season we return most of our starters. 90% of our team will be returning letter winners. We will be returning basically all of our skill players. The mission statement we will live by in future years, will be "numbers and weightroom". In order to build a championship caliber program, your players better be lifting weights in the off season, and that is the culture we need to create here at Wyalusing. I cannot wait for next season to start. We already have a great turn out in the weightroom and want to keep that going all year long! These players deserve a constant coach, and a constant coach they will have. Go Rams!!

# Wyalusing Cross Country

## 2018 Season Recap

WOW, what a season! We came into this season with a set of goals that at the time seemed hard to reach; but it quickly became obvious that these goals were well within our grasp. The season started with flooding that cut short the first day of practice and cancelled the second day of practice. In all, we had 5 practices or meets that were altered due to rain and several more that should have been. In many of our meets, we ran through water puddles, flowing water, and lots of mud . . . But, that did not stop us on our quests.

The boys team had a historic season:

- Undefeated at 12-0
- Lackawanna County Commissioners Champions
- NTL Coaches Meet Champions
- NTL Coaches Meet Combined Champions
- NTL League Champions
- District 4 "A" XC Champions
- PIAA "A" State XC Championships - 3rd Place

Within the first week of practice, I knew that our boys team was going to be extraordinary. Led by veteran runners senior Kevin Heeman, junior Alex Patton, junior Logan Newton and senior Chris McClelland, we had a solid nucleus for this team. Newcomers junior Kemuel Laudermilch and freshman Caleb Stoddard just made our team that much stronger. Seniors Greg Boatman and Tonka Knight, junior Daltin Gowin, sophomores Darevin Curlee and Travis Bahl, as well as freshmen Nick Woodruff and Grady Cobb added to the depth of our team.

Other outstanding accomplishments that this team had this season were: We went 1-2-3 on every team in the League. This is a feat that has not been accomplished in the League for quite some time. In fact, there is only two teams in the entire District 4, that we did not go 1-2-3 on. At the NTL Coaches Invitational, we went 1-2-3-4 on the entire League, scoring just 24 points.

The season was not without its ups and downs. The meet that has made me most proud of our runners was the meet against NEB at NEB. It is not because we beat them and broke their 62 meet winning streak; it is because, that in the face of tragedy, these young men did what teammates do when one is down, they stepped up . . . and stepped up BIG.

This team claimed the first Boys Cross Country NTL Title in 22 years and the first District 4 Title in 21 years . . . And they did it in a dominating fashion. This was the first time since 2006 that

we qualified as a team for the PIAA "A" State XC Championships. Our performance at the PIAA State XC Championships may have not been exactly what we wanted, but it was a great day and we had great performances. Third place at the State Championships with Alex Patton (7) and Kemuel Laudermilch (8) medaling is something to be proud of.

The girls team had an outstanding season:

NL Coaches Invitational Combined Champion

District 4 "A" XC Championships - 6th Place

The team had a solid veteran crew returning with senior Ashlee Newton, and with sophomores Catherine Brown, Carina Beebe, Sierra Allen, and Joannie Nedley. With the addition of freshman Maddi Patton, the girls were not strong in quantity, but were strong in quality. The girls progressed steadily throughout the season. It was awesome to see each one of the runners improve individually as we went through the season, thus fortifying the team. The only loss for the girls came at the first meet of the season with Troy.

Like the boys teams we had our ups and downs; the weather, injuries, and tragedy. But, like the boys team, the girls stayed focused and accomplished the tasks at hand. We persevered through very difficult times; these young athletes proved to be very mature young ladies and made us all proud.

At the District 4 Championships Catherine Brown qualified for the PIAA "A" Championships for the second year in a row. At the State meet, she had to deal with the most difficult course conditions of the day, but powered through for a 113th place finish.
